Regionally aligned with U.S. Africa Command, 2nd SFAB employs force packages consisting of approximately 20 teams of advisors from Fort Liberty, North Carolina. During a three-year assignment to the SFAB, advisors can expect one eight-month deployment to Africa where they conduct focused advising in as part of theater security cooperation missions. The brigade coordinates activities through the U.S. Army Southern European Task Force, Africa. Advisors also work and coordinate their activities in a joint, combined, and interagency environment, requiring a diverse and broadened skillset and experience. Today, as the brigade continues to strengthen partnerships and military cooperation across Africa, it is also ready for large-scale combat operations should crisis and conflict erupt anywhere in the world.
